January.

12th

11.25 a.m. - 12.15 p.m. enemy fired about 9 minnies & 12 merial darts on to the support line of the Centre Coy. One dug-out in support line between BOYAU 72A & 72Z was blown in. Our Stokes & 18 pdrs retaliated on enemy T.M. emplacements. 2 of our Lewis Guns surprised enemy working party opposite SAP 45 at 12.30 a.m. A sharp blast of a whistle was heard, after they fired. Horse & Railway Transport was heard in HULLUCH 3.36 a.m. - 6 a.m.

13th

Our 18 pdrs retaliated whenever Minnies were sent over. At 11.30 a.m. one of our Stokes Guns fired 12 rds, which drew instant retaliation of darts on the left coy & about 6 Minnies on the Centre Coy. Enemy minnied & sent over darts around GREEN CURVE as fellows: - 2.45 p.m. - 3.45 p.m. 2 Minnies & several darts, showers of darts at 9.5 p.m. & 9.10 p.m. 9.45 p.m. - 10.15 p.m. 6 minnies & several darts & also 1 or 2 minnies around No.5 CRATER POST, where trench was blown in in one place.

14th

At ll a.m. mist cleared & our snipers hit two Bosches. Enemy fired aerial darts & Minnies on to our left & centre Coys. during the afternoon & des*royed shelter in Ho.5 CRATER POST. Hostile aeroplanes crossed our line at 2 p.m. flying high in the direction of PHILOSDERNE.

15th

Enemy walking in full view on front line parados epposite
BOYAU 70 hit by our smipers at
10.30 a.m. A quiet morning 2.45p.m.
war field guns retaliated for
Minnies on left Coy. 3.30 p.m.
Heavies were brought to bear on
Kinnie emplacements 1.30 p.m. 1%*
T.M. registered 3 rds from GREEN
CURVE. During the afternoon
several Minnies & bursts of darts
on left Coy, most of which fell
in NO MANS LAMD. Enemy blew tin
trumpets & whistles at 4 p.m. at
point where Stokes dropped behind

15th Contd. from front line further South
4.10 pm. several Germans seen in
far lip of No.5 GRATER but
disappeared before fire could be
brought to bear on them. All
through the night very loud
shouting & whistling were heard
from No.4 & 5 GRATER POSTS.
8 p.m. small explosion heard from
No. 5 GRATER POST behind the far
lip, followed by shrieks & groans.

16th

8.55 a.m. 2 Germans on their parapet H.13.a.4.7. Our snipers fired & one dropped. The other ran along parapet 20x & jumped into trench. He then reappeared immediately waving what appeared to be a flag. Enemy minnied centre Coy during the night. 12 noon enemy heard digging by SAP 45.

17th

German brass band heard playing behind HULLUCH at 11.15 a.m.
8.30 a.m. enemy bex periscope located at bottom of SAP 45 and sniped at. Enemy working on and watching SAP 45 elosely where the 8th Queens raided. Battalion relieved by 8th Queens. Relief complete at 4 p.m. & Battalion moved into Divisional Reserve. PHILOSOPHE. Supplied 60 men for working parties.
