- 25th. Heard we are to take over trenches from 19th Bde. on the 29th.
- 26th. Ordinary Routine.
- 27th. G.O.C 1st Corps was to have inspected us but it was too wet and inspection was postponed. 4 Other ranks joined together with Capt. F.B. STOREY and 2 Lieuts J G BUCKNER, O.S. FLYNN, H.H. RICHARDS, C W FARWELL.
- 28th. Ordinary Routine. ~~Following joined the Batta: Capt F B STOREY, and 2 Lieuts O.S. BUCKNER, O.S. FLYNN, H.H. RICHARDS, and C.W. FARWELL, with 4 other ranks.~~
- SECTION 2 1 CAMBRIN.
- 29th. Batta. paraded at 9 a.m. and marched to CAMBRIN. Relief of 1/Middlesex in 2 1 Section completed by 1 p.m. Quiet day. Casualties Nil.
- 30th. Quiet day. Enemy appear very inactive and supposed to be Saxons. Casualties one other rank killed. 2 Lieut A MUNDY joined & 2 Lieut H. BATTISCOMBE returned from duty with French Mortar Battery.
- 31st. Enemy's snipers more active. Casualties 2 Lt W.B. CARSLAKE wounded. One other rank killed & one wounded.

NOVEMBER.

- 1st. Enemy still showing more activity with snipers but no shelling on our section. Casualties 2 Killed 1 Wounded.
- 2nd. Relieved by 2/Ox & Bucks L.I. by 12.0 (noon). The Batta. marched back to ANNEZIN and went into billets.
- ANNEZIN.
- 3rd. Ordinary Routine. 2 Lieut L.H. BENNETT and 9 Other Ranks joined the Batta.
- 4th. Ordinary Routine.
- 5th. 8 Officers and 400 men proceeded to CAMBRIN for fatigue work at 8 a.m. in lorries supplied by 2nd Divn.
- 6th. Ordinary Routine.
