Attack of Milli would by 19th bde & Worcesters commenced at 4.25 a m - at 10.0 a m attack reported to be progressing favourably about 6.0 p m orders were received for an immediate move - Conference of C.Os held by Bde - weens and 16th K.R.R's were sent up to HIGH NOW, to be under the orders of 19th Brigade. nattalion moved at 9.0 p m to N E Fast corner of MAMETZ WOOD where Capt Foster met Battn & held a conference of Coy Commanders - Capt Foster and B & G Coys moved straight to HIGH WOOD led by guides of 5/Scottish Hifles coming under very heavy H F & gas shell fire on the way & Capt Foster was wounded & handed over command to 2nd Meut Faulkner Lieut Thrupp & 2 cays were sent to report to 212 Coy R E at crows roads OF BACKWILL LA GRAND WOOD on the way a report was made by a stretcher bearer that Men wood had been recaptured by enemy - This was reported to 19th bde & & coys ordered to utand by -

4.0 a m Soom after dawn the Germans were heard shouting and a few were seen moving about and the standard of the mist that had arisen, evidently trying to make their way in round our right finnk imple tire was opened and enemy retired but was frequently seen afterwards and fired on . Maring these operations and idout butterworth was Killed and End Lts Grook & Faulkner wounded - Later on End Lt Milner took a patrol of 20 men and examined the wood in rear of our trenches about 3.0 p m the same officer

took out a patrol of 5 men

on the right - several of
these were wounded & 2nd Lt
Milner went out again to find
them & was not seen again A search party failed to
discover him -

5.0 pm About 5.0 pm a party of enemy were seen to carry out a machine gun on a stretcher on the left flank about 600 yards away - Lewis gun & rifle fire dispersed them.

After dark endeavour was made to connect the trenches in the front line and the strong points on right & left.

Afternoon all companies washed in river & mile off - Draft of 108 other ranks East Surrey, buffs & Gueens arrived - Tente were issued in evening & camp put up.

The Battalion carried on inspection parades, and bayonet righting Guasses in the morning. a drait of 36 other ranks arrived about midday - hoyal bussex and Royal west Kent's composed the draft. The afternoon the men rested and in the evening young & newly promoted N C O's were instructed under Company arrangements.
Two N C O's per Battalion commenced to attend a Ede Eayonet Fighting Course in the morning at 9 a m Course to last 4 days. 2 Lt. E.d'A Collings joined from the Base for Duty.
